September 20th we celebrate Catechetical Sunday. This is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith. Parents are the primary educators of the faith. They are passing down the faith to future generations. Teachers work in a partnership with parents to help build the Body of Christ through prayer, service and knowledge of the faith. Catechesis is a distinct and special ministry in the Church. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church makes clear, “Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church’s life . . . her inner growth and correspondence with God’s plan depend essentially on catechesis”.

WHAT IS CYO

CYO stands for Catholic Youth Organization. The main purpose of CYO is to guide young Catholics to live a Christian life from a young age, develop trust between peers and live a happy life in a positive manner. Here at St. George we bring our high schoolers together each month during the school year to help build relationships between the teens as well as their community. After an opening prayer and a shared meal, we discuss topics, usually of their choosing, to help guide them and live their best lives. We also offer fun activities each month, outside of the meetings, to nurture those relationships and just let kids have good, clean fun. Meetings are the third Sunday of each month, September through April. Other activities are usually scheduled once a month as well. All high schoolers are always welcome to any or all meetings. **Our first meeting is Sunday, September 20th at 6pm.** We are looking forward to another great year!

LIFE OF THE SAINTS- ST. ANDREW KIM TAEGON, PAUL CHONG HASANG, AND COMPANIONS

The evangelization of Korea began during the 17th century through a group of lay persons. A strong vital Christian community flourished there under lay leadership until missionaries arrived from the Paris Foreign Mission Society. During the terrible persecutions that occurred in the 19th century (in 1839, 1866, and 1867), one hundred and three members of the Christian community gave their lives as martyrs. Outstanding among these witnesses to the faith were the first Korean priest and pastor, Andrew Kim Taegon, and the lay apostle, Paul Chong Hasang. Among the other martyrs were a few bishops and priests, but for the most part, lay people, men and women, married and unmarried, children, young people, and the elderly were martyred. All suffered greatly for the Faith and consecrated the rich beginnings of the Church of Korea with their blood as martyrs. Pope John Paul II, during his trip to Korea, canonized these martyrs on May 6, 1984, and inserted their feast into the Calendar of the Universal Church. Their feast day is September 20.
