We ask the parish to continue to pray for our students and teachers as we navigate through these unprecedented times. Many things that we have traditionally done in the past will look different this year. We will not be doing live performances for Veterans Day and the Christmas program. We will be doing both of these via the Home and School Facebook page. Please know this is not our preferred method of sharing our talents; however, we would like to keep everyone as safe as possible.

This week we will be celebrating Red Ribbon Week. Students will be doing different activities to help reinforce living a drug-free life. Since its beginning in 1985, the Red Ribbon campaign has touched the lives of millions of people around the world. In response to the murder of DEA Agent Enrique Camarena, parents and youth in communities across the country began wearing Red Ribbons as a symbol of their commitment to raise awareness of the killing and destruction caused by drugs in America. As people of faith, we are called to share our hope and love with those lives already wounded by this chemical dependency in our nation. We know that God's grace can help those who need recovery and help prevent any more of our young people from getting caught in the snares of alcohol and drug abuse.

### **SCRIP UPDATE**

Families that use the Gerbes Community Rewards program need to turn in a screen shot of their rewards amount on the Gerbes app for the July - September quarter to 573-645-9020 or [sgscrip@yahoo.com](mailto:sgscrip@yahoo.com) for their family to receive the rebates applied towards their family's registration. The scrip coordinator does not receive a report of family earnings from the program, so if you do not report your earnings to the scrip coordinator, the unclaimed rebate will go towards paying for school copiers. The Gerbes Community Rewards program links to your Gerbes shopping card number so every time it is used, you earn rewards that you can put towards St. George School. ### **ONLINE GIVING TRANSITION**

St. George Parish is transitioning our online giving platform from ParishSoft to Blackbaud. The new platform gives a higher level of security, lower transaction fees, and is more uniform throughout the Diocese of Jefferson City. As of the end of October, we will no longer be able to complete transactions on the current ParishSoft platform. If you currently use our online payment program for credit card payments/donations, you will be receiving an email from the parish with a request to change to our new online giving platform with Blackbaud and the link to our new online giving page. Please make all future online payments using the new system. There will be no change to those who give utilizing the bank draft ACH programs that run weekly or twice a month (on the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 18<sup>th</sup> of the month). ### **LIFE OF THE SAINTS- ST. ANTHONY MARY CLARET**

Claretian archbishop and founder. Anthony was born in Salient in Catalonia, Spain, in 1807, the son of a weaver. He took up weaving but then studied for the priesthood, desiring to be a Jesuit. Ill health prevented his entering the Order, and he served as a secular priest. In 1849, he founded the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, known today as the Claretians, and the Apostolic Training Institute of the Immaculate Conception, Claretian nuns. From 1850 to 1857, Anthony served as the archbishop of Santiago de Cuba. He returned to the court of Queen Isabella II as confessor, and went into exile with her in 1868. In 1869 and 1870, Anthony participated in the First Vatican Council. He died in the Cistercian monastery of Fontfroide, France on October 24, 1870. Anthony Mary Claret had the gift of prophecy and performed many miracles. He was opposed by the liberal forces of Spain and Cuba and endured many trials.
