SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY COMPLIANCE

To ensure that St. George is providing a safe environment for our most vulnerable parishioners to work, learn, play, pray, worship, and socialize, the Diocese of Jefferson City has updated our safe environment policy. Under this policy, all adult volunteers (18 and older that are no longer in high school) and Catholic School parents are required to complete a VIRTUS training online or in person if they have not already done so, complete the Child Abuse or Neglect Registry background check form, and read and consent to the Code of Pastoral Conduct. If you have completed the VIRTUS training before, you should be able to log in to your account to fill out the necessary forms to update your compliance. If you have never attended VIRTUS, you can register for in-person or online training at www.virtusonline.org. Once you register, you should also receive access to the electronic Code of Pastoral Conduct form. The Child Abuse and Neglect Registry background check form is the only form that cannot be completed online. Copies of this form are available in the parish office and in the back of church. This information is for all Catholic school parents and all volunteers, whether working the picnic, cleaning the church, or participating in choir or worship liturgies. LIVES OF THE SAINTS—ST. JOHN FRANCIS REGIS

Born into a family of some wealth, John Francis was so impressed by his Jesuit educators that he wished to enter the Society of Jesus, & did so at age 18. Despite his rigorous academic schedule, he spent many hours in chapel, often to the dismay of fellow seminarians who were concerned about his health. Following his ordination to the priesthood, John Francis undertook missionary work in various French towns. While the formal sermons of the day tended toward the poetic, his discourses were plain, but revealed the fervor within him and attracted people of all classes. Father Regis made himself available to the poor. Many mornings were spent in the confessional or at the altar celebrating Mass; afternoons were reserved for visits to prisons and hospitals. The bishop of Viviers, sought to draw on his many gifts, especially needed during the prolonged civil and religious strife then rampant throughout France. For three years, Father Regis traveled throughout the diocese, conducting missions in advance of a visit by the bishop. He succeeded in converting many people and brought many others back to religious observances. The last four years of his life were spent preaching and organizing social services, especially for prisoners, the sick and the poor. In the autumn of 1640, Father Regis sensed that his days were coming to a conclusion. He settled some of his affairs & continued to speak to people about the God who loved them. On December 31, he spent most of the day with his eyes on the crucifix. That evening, he died & was later canonized in 1737.
