**SEEKING SCRIP VOLUNTEERS**

Due to the new changes with our scrip program, we will no longer be able to do direct sales during the week at the parish office, but will continue with direct sales before and after weekend Mass. Orders received during the week will need to be placed electronically via the RaiseRight app, emailed to [sgscrip@yahoo.com](mailto:sgscrip@yahoo.com), or dropped off at the parish office to be filled by a volunteer. During the school year, you can continue to send orders via kidmail. You will be notified when your order is ready to be picked up. Most times it will take 24 – 48 hours to fill your weekday scrip orders.

We are in need of volunteers to help with the Scrip Program. A Diocesan policy has been brought to our attention, that requires our Scrip Program to be sold, coordinated, and maintained by volunteers (no employees). Our Scrip program helps considerably with our school expenses as it fully covers all the expenses for the school copiers (~\$8–10,000/year). It is imperative to the continuation of the Scrip Program that we find volunteers to help us divide up the coordinator’s role. Please contact the parish office if you are interested in keeping our Scrip program alive by volunteering in the following areas:

- 1 – Week day Scrip Sellers: Fill orders during the week and complete a weekly sales report. *(Multiple Volunteers Needed)*
- 2 – 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday Monthly Scrip Seller: fill orders 15 minutes before & after Mass & complete sales report.
- 3 – Sales Calendar Coordinator: Create a yearly schedule (August – July) of Scrip Sellers for week day and weekend Mass volunteers. Post schedule on social media.
- 4 – Purchase Coordinator: Create purchase orders and schedule volunteer pick up of local Scrip to maintain inventory or fill Scrip orders, update sales reports, receive, & restock inventory.
- 5 – Rebate Coordinator: Runs end of the year reports after March 31 and reconciles rebates for all the programs/families.
- 6 – Marketing Coordinator: Advertise Scrip specials, grow the program to include other business in which our customers are interested, and help sign people up for the Scrip Program.

**LIVES OF THE SAINTS–ST. BERNARDINO REALINO**

St. Bernardino Realino was born into a noble family of Capri, Italy in 1530. After receiving a thorough and devout Christian education at the hands of his mother, he went on to study medicine at the University of Bologna, but after three years he switched to law and received his doctorate in 1563. Word of his learning, dedication, and legal brilliance spread rapidly, and in 1554 he was summoned to Naples to assume the position of auditor and lieutenant general. There he came to the realization that he had a religious vocation and, aided by our Lady’s appearance to him, joined the Society of Jesus, being ordained in 1567. For three years he labored unstintingly at Naples, devoting himself to the service of the poor and the youth, and then he was sent to Lecce where he remained for the last forty-two years of his life. St. Bernardino won widespread recognition as a result of his ceaseless apostolic labors. He was a model confessor, a powerful preacher, a diligent teacher of the Faith to the young, a dedicated shepherd of souls, as well as Rector of the Jesuit college in Lecce and Superior of the Community there.
