SAFE ENVIRONMENT UPDATE

Thank you to all those that have updated and attained compliance with the new Diocesan Safe Environment Policy. There has been a small change and as of July 1, instead of the Child Abuse and Neglect background check paper form, we will need to do a criminal background check via selection.com. You should have a prompt to complete this background check when you log into your virtue account if it is needed, or when you register for a first time Virtus training. If you have filled out and turned in your Child Abuse and Neglect paper form prior to July 1, and all your other requirements are met, you should be compliant with the policy. SEEKING SCRIP VOLUNTEERS

Due to the new changes with our scrip program, we will no longer be able to do direct sales during the week at the parish office, but will continue with direct sales before and after weekend Mass. Orders received during the week will need to be placed electronically via the RaiseRight app, emailed to sgscrip@yahoo.com, or dropped off at the parish office to be filled by a volunteer. During the school year, you can continue to send orders via kidmail. You will be notified when your order is ready to be picked up. Most times it will take 24 – 48 hours to fill your weekday scrip orders. Electronic Scrip through the RaiseRight app and paid for via credit card or bank draft will be available in your RaiseRight wallet immediately.

We are in need of volunteers to help with the Scrip Program. A Diocesan policy has been brought to our attention, that requires our Scrip Program to be sold, coordinated, and maintained by volunteers (no employees). Our Scrip program helps considerably with our school expenses as it fully covers all the expenses for the school copiers (~\$8–10,000/year). It is imperative to the continuation of the Scrip Program that we find volunteers to help us divide up the coordinator's role. Please contact the parish office if you are interested in keeping our Scrip program alive by volunteering in the following areas:

- 1 – Week day Scrip Sellers: Fill orders during the week and complete a weekly sales report. (*Multiple Volunteers Needed*)
- 2 – Sales Calendar Coordinator: Create a yearly schedule (August – July) of Scrip Sellers for week day and weekend Mass volunteers. Post schedule on social media.
- 3 – Marketing Coordinator: Advertise Scrip specials, grow the program to include other business in which our customers are interested, and help sign people up for the Scrip Program.

LIVES OF THE SAINTS—ST. GRIMBALD

Saint Gribald was a Benedictine monk, and prior of St. Bertin religious community. Alfred of England was inspired with the man's heavenliness, and when he climbed the position of authority, Alfred asked Gribald to come to England to share his insight and blessedness. Gribald touched base in England around 885 and inspired numerous people with his insight into Scripture, his ability in music, and his heavenliness. Gribald helped found the University of Oxford, and filled in as its first educator of heavenliness. He is credited with restoring learning to England. He later declined the position of ward of Canterbury and resigned to Winchester. With the Lord's support, he started the establishment of Newminster, and was then introduced as abbot. Following two decades in England, Gribald became ill. He took Communion, went through a few days in examination, and assembled the priests of the network to his space for one final time of partnership just before he died.
