SCHOOL NEWS FROM THE PRINCIPAL

The school has a lot of school uniforms that will be available for parents to pick up at Open House on August 7th. If you would like to stop by school and go through the clothes before then please contact Mrs. Grellner, so we can make arrangements. Some of the uniforms still have tags on them. If you would like to drop off uniforms for others to get, that would be fine as well. We are truly a community in which we help each other.

If your child is eligible to participate in sports this year, please remember that we need a current sports physical on hand prior to the start of practice.

Students in grades 5-8 will be given the opportunity to learn embroidery and cross stitch. If you have a child that would like to learn please contact Mrs. Grellner. Once we have some participants, there will be an opportunity to make a quilt for the quilt auction.

Remember that all school parents need to take the Virtus training class before the start of school. If you have taken the class several years ago you might need a current background check. Please log onto your Virtus account to check to see if you are in need of a current background check. Again if you have any questions, please contact me.

Also if you have not turned in your registration papers, you can turn them in by mailing them to PO Box 19, or drop them off at the parish office if no one is at the school office.

SEEKING SCRIP VOLUNTEERS

Due to the new changes with our scrip program, we will no longer be able to do direct sales during the week at the parish office, but will continue with direct sales before and after weekend Mass. Orders received during the week will need to be placed electronically via the RaiseRight app, emailed to sgscrip@yahoo.com, or dropped off at the parish office to be filled by a volunteer. During the school year, you can continue to send orders via kidmail. You will be notified when your order is ready to be picked up. Most times it will take 24 – 48 hours to fill your weekday scrip orders. Electronic Scrip through the RaiseRight app and paid for via credit card or bank draft will be available in your RaiseRight wallet immediately.

We are in need of volunteers to help with the Scrip Program, which helps considerably with our school expenses by fully covering all the expenses for the school copiers (~\$8–10,000/year). It is imperative to the continuation of the Scrip Program that we find volunteers to help. Please contact the parish office to help in the following areas:

- 1 – Week day Scrip Sellers: Fill orders during the week and complete a weekly sales report. (*Multiple Volunteers Needed*)
- 2 – Sales Calendar Coordinator: Create a yearly schedule (August – July) of Scrip Sellers for week day and weekend Mass volunteers. Post schedule on social media.
- 3 – Marketing Coordinator: Advertise Scrip specials, grow the program to include other business in which our customers are interested, and help sign people up for the Scrip Program.


SAFE ENVIRONMENT UPDATE

Thank you to all those that have updated and attained compliance with the new Diocesan Safe Environment Policy. There has been a small change and as of July 1, instead of the Child Abuse and Neglect background check paper form, we will need to do a criminal background check via selection.com. You should have a prompt to complete this background check when you log into your virtus account if it is needed, or when you register for a first time Virtus training. If you have filled out and turned in your Child Abuse and Neglect paper form prior to July 1, and all your other requirements are met, you should be compliant with the policy. LIVES OF THE SAINTS—ST. JOHN GAULBERT, ABBOT

Saint John Gaulbert was born in Florence. Although he enjoyed the benefits of an early Christian education, his youthful heart was soon attracted to the vanities of the world. A painful incident was the means God made use of, to open his eyes. Hugo, his only brother, had been murdered and St. John had resolved to avenge his death. On a certain Good Friday he met his enemy in a place where there was no escape for the latter. St. John drew his sword and would have killed his adversary on the spot, but the latter threw himself on his knees begging him by the passion of Jesus Christ to spare his life. St. John was touched at the words, embraced his enemy, entered a church and prayed with many tears for the pardon of his sins. He then entered the Order of St. Benedict, in which he made such great progress in virtue that after the death of the Abbot, the monks wished to impose this dignity upon him, but the Saint absolutely refused to accept it. Sometime later, he left the monastery with one companion in quest of greater solitude. Having visited the hermitage of Camaldoli, he finally settled at Valle Ombrosa in Tuscany. Together with two hermits whom he found there, he and his companions built a small monastery, observing the primitive rule of St. Benedict. Thus was laid the foundation of the Order of Vallombrosa. The humility of the saint was such that he would never be promoted, even to Minor Orders. His charity for the poor caused him to make a rule that no indigent person should be sent away without an alms. He founded several monasteries, reformed others, and succeeded in eradicating the vice of simony from the part of the country where he lived. He died on July 12, 1073, at about 80 years of age and his Feast day is July 12th.
