SEEKING SCRIP VOLUNTEERS

Due to the new changes with our scrip program, we will no longer be able to do direct sales during the week at the parish office, but will continue with direct sales before and after weekend Mass. Orders received during the week will need to be placed electronically via the RaiseRight app, emailed to sgscrip@yahoo.com, or dropped off at the parish office to be filled by a volunteer. During the school year, you can continue to send orders via kidmail. You will be notified when your order is ready to be picked up. Most times it will take 24 – 48 hours to fill your weekday scrip orders. Electronic Scrip through the RaiseRight app and paid for via credit card or bank draft will be available in your RaiseRight wallet immediately.

We are in need of volunteers to help with the Scrip Program, which helps considerably with our school expenses by fully covering all the expenses for the school copiers (~\$8–10,000/year). It is imperative to the continuation of the Scrip Program that we find volunteers to help. Please contact the parish office to help in the following areas:

- 1 – Week day Scrip Sellers: Fill orders during the week and complete a weekly sales report. (*Multiple Volunteers Needed*)
- 2 – Sales Calendar Coordinator: Create a yearly schedule (August – July) of Scrip Sellers for week day and weekend Mass volunteers. Post schedule on social media.
- 3 – Marketing Coordinator: Advertise Scrip specials, grow the program to include other business in which our customers are interested, and help sign people up for the Scrip Program.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT UPDATE

Thank you to all those that have updated and attained compliance with the new Diocesan Safe Environment Policy. There has been a small change and as of July 1, instead of the the Child Abuse and Neglect background check paper form, we will need to do a criminal background check via selection.com. You should have a prompt to complete this background check when you log into your virtus account if it is needed, or when you register for a first time Virtus training. If you have filled out and turned in your Child Abuse and Neglect paper form prior to July 1, and all your other requirements are met, you should be compliant with the policy. LIVES OF THE SAINTS—ST. ARSENIUS THE GREAT

Arsenius the Great, also called Arsenius of Rome, (born c. 354, Rome—died c. 455; feast day July 19), Roman noble, later monk of Egypt, whose asceticism among the Christian hermits in the Libyan Desert caused him to be ranked among the celebrated Desert Fathers and influenced the development of the monastic and contemplative life in Eastern and Western Christendom. Born of a Roman senatorial family, Arsenius was a deacon. Recommended by Damasus about 383, he was called to the court of Emperor Theodosius I the Great (ruled 379–395) in Constantinople and entrusted with the education of Theodosius's sons Arcadius and Honorius. After 11 years of tutoring, Arsenius retired to the eremitical life on Mount Scete in the Libyan Desert. Shortly afterward, he was forced to flee to Troe, near ancient Memphis, Egypt, in order to escape the devastating incursions of the Libyan Mazici tribesmen, whom he likened to the Goths and Huns who ravaged Rome. Following an odyssey of approximately 15 years throughout the Egyptian wilderness, he died in the desert of Scete. He was reputed to have lived for more than 100 years.
