CATHOLIC YOUTH ORGANIZATION (CYO)

The main purpose of CYO is to guide young Catholics to live a Christian life from a young age, develop trust between peers and live a happy life in a positive manner. CYO is an avenue for continuing their formation as young Catholics in a relaxed, informal atmosphere. Here at St. George we bring our high school aged youth together each month during the school year to help build relationships between the teens as well as their community. After an opening prayer and a shared meal, we discuss topics, usually of their choosing, to help guide them and live their best lives. We also offer fun activities each month, outside of the meetings, to nurture those relationships and just let kids have good, clean fun. Meetings are the second Wednesday of each month, September through April. Other activities are usually scheduled once a month as well. All high school aged youth are always welcome to any or all meetings.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NEWS

The goal this year is to raise \$650,000 in funds to support the Cardinal Glennon Development Center and the local handicap education programs.

STEWARDSHIP MODEL

In accordance with the Diocesan Pastoral Plan, our diocese is placing a renewed emphasis on the need for all Catholics to live as active stewards and disciples who receive the gifts of God gratefully in their lives, cultivate them responsibly, and then share them out of love with God and others. Living a life of active stewardship begins in the family, supports and builds up our parish communities, and flows out into the world. There are three important aspects to live as active stewards including:

- **Pray:** Attend Mass faithfully in the parish on weekends and holy days.
- **Participate:** Use their time and talent to strengthen the parish community.
- **Sacrificially Give:** Pledge and remain current on a tithe of financial first fruits to support the ministries of the parish. The goal is eight percent to the parish and two percent to other worthy charities.

St. George is in the second group of cohorts to roll out this Stewardship Model in our parish by July of 2022. The first and second group of cohorts includes 32 parishes and 18 schools. The remainder of parishes in our diocese will begin the process of transitioning to this model in July 2023. We will soon form a Stewardship Committee to plan and guide our roll out of the Stewardship Model in our parish.

ST. SALVIUS OF ALBI

Bishop of Albi and a friend of Pope St. Gregory I the Great. Also called Sauve, he was a native of Albi and, originally a lawyer, he entered a monastery and served for a time as a monk before receiving election as abbot. Then, after, living as a hermit, he became a bishop, serving as shepherd of Albi from 574-584. He reportedly died while caring for the sick during an outbreak of some epidemic. He also ransomed prisoners and brought King Chilperic back to orthodox teachings. His feast day is September 10.
