### MASS INTENTIONS

St. George is happy to help you schedule Masses for your loved ones, but there are some guidelines that we follow as instructed by Canon Law and by advisement of the Diocese. The Diocese has set a Mass stipend rate of \$10 that is requested for each Mass to help cover the expense of using the church, electric, communion hosts, etc. If you cannot afford the stipend, but desire a Mass, please discuss it with the pastor. For weekend and Holy Day Masses, one Mass must be reserved for all of our parishioners and cannot have a scheduled intention, but if there is a second Mass for that day, we can schedule an intention. Although in the past we provided the possibility of shared Mass intentions, it was meant to be a rare occurrence. As of October 1, 2021 we will no longer schedule any shared Masses. If you already have a shared Mass intentions scheduled, we will complete your shared intentions, but we will no longer schedule any more. In order to give an equal opportunity to those wishing to schedule a Mass intention, we will be limiting the weekend Mass availability to four per year and only one daily Mass per month. Also, we are only allowed to take stipends for Masses that can be completed within the year. If you have any questions, please contact Fr. Franklin or Brenda at the parish office.

### ST. FINBAR

He was the son of an artisan and a lady of the Irish royal court. Born in Connaught, Ireland, and baptized Lochan, he was educated at Kilmacahil, Kilkenny, where the monks named him Fionnbharr (white head) because of his light hair; he is also known as Bairre and Barr. He went on pilgrimage to Rome with some of the monks, visiting on the way back. Supposedly, on another visit to Rome the Pope wanted to consecrate him a bishop but was deterred by a vision, notifying the pope that God had reserved that honor to Himself, and Finbar was consecrated from heaven and then returned to Ireland. At any rate, he may have preached in Scotland, definitely did in southern Ireland, lived as a hermit on a small island at Lough Eiroe, and then, on the river Lee, founded a monastery that developed into the city of Cork, of which he was the first bishop. His monastery became famous in southern Ireland and attracted numerous disciples. Many extravagant miracles are attributed to him, and supposedly, the sun did not set for two weeks after he died at Cloyne about the year 633. His feast day is September 25th.
