ST. ALDEGUNAIS

Virgin and abess, also known as Adelgundis, Aldegonde, or Orgonne. She was a member of the royal family of the Merovingians & her parents were saints: St. Walbert & St. Bertila. The family resided in the Hainault region of Flanders. Aldegundis refused offers of marriage from other nobles & received the veil from St. Amandius, the bishop of Maastricht. She followed this ceremony of acceptance into the religious life with the foundation of a convent near the Sambre River, at a desert site called Malbode. Aldegundis’ foundation became Mauberge, a Benedictine monastery, later taken over by canonesses. Aldegundis is reported to have died of cancer at the age of forty-four.
