PRIVATE FACILITY RENTAL INSURANCE

As of April 1, the Diocese is requiring that any private rental/use of our facilities will either need to show proof of event insurance or purchase an event insurance policy through our Diocesan vendor. The policy through the Diocese is \$95 per event and requires 20-day notice to process the policy. ***If liquor is being sold or included in ticket price at your event, you will also need an additional liquor liability policy.*** Winter-Dent will give you a quote on the price for that coverage. These costs will be an additional expense beyond the rental fee and deposit amounts. If you have any questions, please contact the parish office for further details.

ST. ABDIESUS

Also called Hebed Jesus, a deacon in the Christian community of Persia who was caught up in the persecutions conducted by King Shapur II. Records indicate that Abdiesus was accompanied in his martyrdom by Abrosimus, Aceptimus, Azadan, Azades, Bicolor, Mareas, Milles, and a woman named Tarbula. Some were Persian courtiers, priests & bishops. Tarbula was the sister of St. Simeon, and suffered a particularly cruel death.
