One of the more significant projects this summer is dismantling the computer lab. Students did not use a computer lab due to using Chromebooks. Dana, Greg, and Oliver Augustine took all computers, monitors, and printers to the recycling center. This was a huge undertaking, and we appreciate their hard work.

THE SPIRITUALITY OF STEWARDSHIP

As we look towards moving into the Stewardship Model as a parish in the Diocese of Jefferson City, we wanted to provide the parish with information on the Spirituality of Stewardship. There are four pillars to stewardship including Hospitality, Formation, Prayer, and Service. We will review one of the pillars each week over the next four weeks. First, ***The Pillar of Formation***: "I, the Lord, our God, teach you what is for your good, and lead you on the way you should go." Isaiah 46:17. Formation involves education for the mind and conversion of the heart. To know the "stewardship way of life", does not make one live a "stewardship way of life." Ongoing Catholic education is important if we are to grow in our lives as stewards. Formation educates, engages, and empowers individual stewards to love as God loves us which in turn strengthens the parish community.

Strengthened by the Eucharist and formed by our weekly participation in the sacrificial meal which is the ultimate model for self-giving love, we must see those in need around us, and "give them some food ourselves."
