### PSR REGISTRATIONS

We are beginning to accept registrations for the St. George PSR program. The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is our religious education & sacramental preparation program open to students K-8th grade who attend any local public or home school. ***We are looking for two Virtus-trained volunteers to serve as PSR teachers needed for the elementary program.*** They will be given the resources necessary for passing on our Catholic faith to children. PSR is held on Wednesdays, 4-5:30pm, September through April in the Notre Dame Hall Basement. Parents can register their children in the PSR program by filling out & the registration form on the parish website under the religious education tab. ### STEWARDSHIP WAY OF LIFE – ACTIVE STEWARDS

As we move forward in the Stewardship Way of Life, all parishioners are called to be active stewards in the life of our parish. ***To live as an active steward, all parishioners are asked to commit to pray, participate, and sacrificially give.*** *The commitment to pray* includes actively and regularly attending Mass on weekends and Holy Days of Obligation. *The commitment to participate* is to offer time and talents to serve the parish community and be a part of its fellowship and opportunities for ongoing Christian formation. *The commitment to sacrificially give* is to generously give a proportionate pledge of the "first fruits" of material treasure to support the operation and ministries of the parish. All parish families are expected to live these sacrificial commitments through the completion of the annual stewardship forms that will roll out to the parish in October. Parish families who strive to live as active stewards may have their children sponsored through the stewardship of the people of the parish for enrollment in the Catholic school. It is understood that parish sponsored enrollment in a Catholic school is contingent upon the family's practice of their faith. The job of a Catholic school is to help parents, who are the primary educators of their children accomplish the task of raising faithful disciples and stewards. This is why the parish funds the ministry of the school and sponsors the children of families who are striving to live as active stewards to enroll in it. The school is not separate from the parish; it is a ministry of the parish. Unlike private schools that charge tuition in return for the service of providing education, Catholic schools have a broader mission and goals that mimic the parish's goals to strengthen the parish community, form faithful Christians, proclaim the presence of the Kingdom of God in our midst, & provide a solid education.
