THE ABC'S OF DIVINE MERCY

Since we will begin to recite the Divine Mercy Chaplet before Mass on the first weekend of the month, we wanted to provide information on the message of Divine Mercy. There will be resources available in the back of church with information about Divine Mercy and how to pray the chaplet using Rosary beads. We also recite the Divine Mercy Chaplet every Tuesday at 3pm in the chapel. All are welcome!

Last week we informed you of the Message of Divine Mercy. This week we want to share how to exercise this message of mercy; it's as easy as A-B-C.

A - Ask for God's Mercy. God wants us to approach Him, to repent of our sins, and ask Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world. Through revelation to St. Faustina, God reveals, "I cannot punish even the greatest sinner if he makes an appeal to My compassion, but on the contrary, I justify him in My unfathomable and inscrutable mercy." (Diary, 1146). The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the best way to ask for God's mercy.

B- Be Merciful to Others. God wants us to receive His mercy and in turn, be merciful to others by our actions, words, and prayers. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us. Great ways to exercise mercy are by performing the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

C - Completely Trust In Jesus. Trust in Jesus is the very essence of the message of Divine Mercy. What does this "trust" entail? It entails surrendering to God our will and our deeds, dedicating our lives to Him, and entrusting ourselves to His care in good times and in bad. It entails us entering into an authentic love with the One who loves us, including when we sin, and in turn, we must trust that He wants what is best for us.

MASS CHANGES BEGINNING IN SEPTEMBER

Beginning in September the First Saturday Mass will be moved to 8am and alternating locations between St. George, Linn and St. Joseph, Westphalia. First Saturday Mass September 3 will be in Westphalia at 8am and the following First Saturday Mass October 1 will be in Linn at 8am.

Also beginning in September we will start reciting the Divine Mercy Chaplet before Mass on the Saturday and Sunday Mass on the first weekend of the month instead of the Rosary. All other weekends we will continue to recite the Rosary before weekend Masses.

MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR ABORTED CHILDREN

Saturday, September 10, pro-life Americans throughout the country will gather at the gravesites of aborted babies and other memorial sites dedicated in their honor for the ninth annual National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children. Solemn vigils will be held to commemorate the more than 60 million children who have lost their lives to legal abortion since 1973 and to remind our society of the humanity of the unborn child. Please join us for the memorial service in our community on Saturday, September 10, with Holy Mass celebrated by Father Richard Frank at 10:00 am followed by outside Memorial Service at Aborted Babies Headstone in front of St Andrew Church, Holts Summit at approximately 10:45 am. Together let us remember the victims of abortion and pray for a final end to this injustice in our land during the National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children.
