THE DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed on ordinary Rosary beads. In praying the chaplet, we are uniting ourselves with Jesus' sacrifice offered on the Cross for the salvation of the world. We are asking for mercy for us and for the whole world, with us referring to the person reciting the chaplet and those for whom they desire to offer it. The whole world refers to all people living on earth and the souls in Purgatory. Praying the chaplet is performing an act of love toward our neighbor, which along with trust, is the indispensable condition for obtaining graces. One of the special promises of those that pray the chaplet is the grace of a happy and peaceful death. This grace may be obtained not only by those who recite the chaplet with confidence and perseverance, but also by the dying at whose bedside others will pray it. Jesus told St. Faustina that "Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy." (Diary, 687) Jesus promised to grant grace to those who recite this prayer at least once in their lifetime, providing it is said with an attitude of complete trust, humility, and a sincere, deep sorrow for sin.
