SCHOOL NEWS FROM THE PRINCIPAL

St. George School has been in session for one month. I am impressed with the dedication of our students & faculty. With each week, it becomes more apparent how blessed we are with our school faculty. There is so much learning and growing happening at SGS. Our primary grades are working on those developing fundamental skills in all subject areas. Intermediate grades are growing into learners that are more independent. Junior High has recently returned from Camp Wonderland. The kids worked on leadership & team-building skills. A lot of time and effort went into ensuring this was a successful, meaningful experience for our students. We would also be remiss if we didn't mention the fantastic chaperones that took off work to ensure our kids' safety. Events such as this camp help bring community to our school and help us live out our mission of being Christ-centered and faith-directed in all that we are. Part of our school mission statement includes that we educate the whole child, and this camp experience is another way our students learn and embrace life outside the classroom.

THE IMAGE OF DIVINE MERCY

The image of Divine Mercy originates from a vision that Saint Faustina had in which Christ expressed His desire to have such an image painted and that the words in the signature beneath it be "Jesus, I trust in You." The image represents the Risen Christ, whose hands & feet bear the marks of the crucifixion. From His pierced heart, two rays issue forth; red and pale. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. Sin is wiped away by the cleansing waters of Baptism and the healing words of Confession. The red ray stands for the Blood, which is the life of souls, which we receive in the Holy Eucharist. "These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross" (299). The image portrays the great mercy of God, which was fully revealed in the Paschal Mystery of Christ, and is manifested in the Church most effectively through the Holy Sacraments. Jesus told Saint Faustina "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I myself will defend it as My own glory,"(Diary, 48). Keep in mind that we don't worship the canvas, paint, or the image itself – we worship what it represents: Jesus, the Divine Mercy.
