GOOD SHEPHERD FOOD DRIVE NOVEMBER 5 & 6

St. George CYO will be sponsoring a food drive to help fill the Good Shepherd Food Pantry for families in need in Osage County. The stimulus money given to the food pantry has dried up and the Food Bank in Columbia has had to cut drastically the amount of food distributed to all of the food pantries, while the number of families in need in our local area has increased considerably. The pantry is running very short & need all canned vegetables *except* green beans, and dry food *except* pasta noodles and Mac & Cheese. **A list of items they could use includes:** jelly, cake mix, brownie mix, cookie mix, frosting, stuffing mix, instant potatoes, evaporated or condensed milk, pudding or jello mix, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, flour, brown sugar, pickles, pickle relish, dry packaged of hidden valley mix, pie crust mix, corn bread mix, pumpkin, pie filling or canned fruit. ***CYO youth will be gathering food before/after Mass on November 5th & 6th. You can also leave food donations in the back of church all this week. Please help us help those in need in our community.***
