Over Lent we may begin to introduce these new Mass settings during our liturgies and they will be focused on specifically during choir practices on Thursdays, 7 – 8:15pm in St. George Church. Choir practices will be held on 3/16, 3/23, and 3/30. The Mass of St. Frances Cabrini will be used at the rededication of the Cathedral on May 5th.
