**He told stories from his childhood and how he saved college football.**

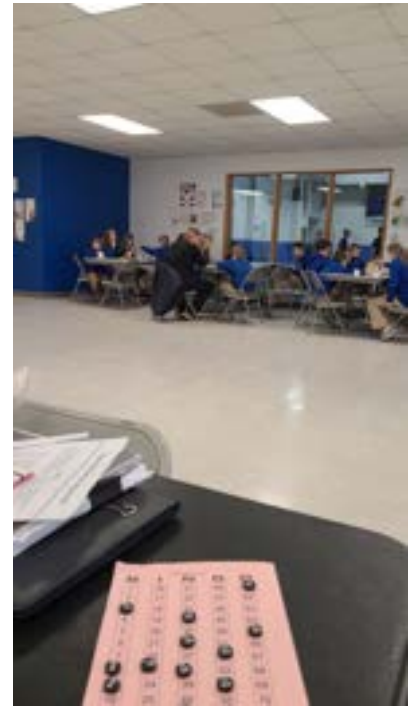
**Tuesday: Team building Day. We played games that showed us how to enjoy the fellowship of SGS.**
