NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE

As part of our National Eucharistic Revival, 4 pilgrimages will take place from the edges of the United States. Our diocese is on the St. Junipero Serra Route, the longest route travelling from San Francisco to Indianapolis. Together, we will journey with Christ on his way to the 10th National Eucharistic Congress, where he comes to encounter his people anew. The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will be traveling through our diocese from July 1-5, 2024, stopping in Sedalia, Boonville, Jefferson City, Columbia and Starkeburg. 12 perpetual pilgrims that have committed to walk from San Francisco to Indianapolis will process the Eucharist along the Katy Trail from parish to parish. Individuals are welcome to walk with them, assuming responsibility for themselves.
