SCHOOL NEWS FROM THE PRINCIPAL

We have numerous areas around school that could use extra cleaning/organizing. Anyone interested in helping or any high school students needing A plus hours for service should contact the school office at 573897-3650 or email Mrs. Grellner at lgrellner@saint-george-parish.org.

St. George has several building & grounds projects:

- The Knights of Columbus replaced the dishwasher in the cafeteria which was installed on June 10.
- St. Anne’s Society will replace a warmer in the cafeteria. We are hoping that it will arrive in time for use at the picnic.
- We had to replace the condensing unit on the large walk-in freezer at a total cost of \$7,131.00 for labor and parts.
- We are currently working on the fencing project around school. This project has been funded through a private donor, Knights of Columbus, and Home and School.
- We replaced 4 nonfunctional windows in the intermediate level of the school with windows donated by Quaker.
- We were recently informed that the bricks in back of the school will need some tuck pointing, and be sealed to keep the moisture out of the building. We don’t know the full extent of the repairs but it could roughly be around \$20,000.
- We have formed a committee to make the area in front of the school more aesthetically pleasing. More information will be provided at a later date, as we finalize plans.

Despite some expensive repairs and different projects going around, we are so blessed to have the school that we have and the staff that we have hired. Many schools in our area are still looking for teachers to fill their positions. We are blessed and will continue to grow spiritually and academically.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE

As part of our National Eucharistic Revival, 4 pilgrimages will take place from the edges of the United States. Our diocese is on the St. Junipero Serra Route, the longest route travelling from San Francisco to Indianapolis. Together, we will journey with Christ on his way to the 10th National Eucharistic Congress, where he comes to encounter his people anew. The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will be traveling through our diocese from July 1-5, 2024, stopping in Sedalia, Boonville, Jefferson City, Columbia and Starkenburg. 12 perpetual pilgrims that have committed to walk from San Francisco to Indianapolis will process the Eucharist along the Katy Trail from parish to parish. Individuals are welcome to walk with them, assuming responsibility for themselves.
