Anyone interested in becoming a collection counting team to count the weekend collections should contact the parish office. We would like to add three or more teams to the rotation.

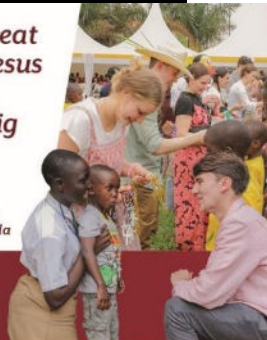

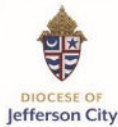

WOMENS HEALTH SURVEY

Fr. Dan since his ministry at Newman, has become more & more aware of the need to change the standard of care provided to women. Through talks on the "Genius of the Body", he has become concerned with the number of females who express not understanding well the functioning of the female body. This goes together with the sub-standard healthcare they have experienced with a majority of healthcare providers, for example, offering women the quick fix of a pill, a pharmaceutical, contraceptives, in vitro fertilization, etc., which do not respond to the actual problems or issues women are facing. Our Church is pro-woman & we need to significantly support women's health holistically & ethically with healthcare that listens in order to provide for what their needs are & how God designed their bodies. Fr. Dan is working with a number of women in Columbia to establish a Women's Health Clinic that will respond to these needs. Inspired by the Guiding Star Project (founded by Leah Jacobson, author of "Wholistic Feminism"): <https://guidingstarproject.com/>, such a Clinic will offer essential services such as fertility care, pregnancy care, lactation consultation, pre & post menopausal care, family support, & several other female health services. Imagine a place where females can go during business hours to learn Natural Family Planning (NFP), feel safe, & know the care they receive aligns with their personal health needs on a regular basis. This could be a culture changing service for Columbia & surrounding areas! At this point, we need to gather some survey data regarding the interest from women. PLEASE HELP!
