CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP RENEWAL (CSR)

This year's theme for our Catholic Stewardship Renewal is "Without Cost you have received, without cost you are to give." This verse is in Matthew 10 when Jesus commissions his twelve disciples to go and find the lost sheep and proclaim the "The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand." And why are they being called to do this? Because we were created in the image of God and we are all called to be his hands and feet to love and serve using our God given gifts. Jesus sends his disciples to teach the way to salvation. Without cost we have received God's love and grace and therefore we are called to give without cost to others. Catholic Stewardship Renewal commitment weekend is October 19 – 20. Now is the time to discern and pray about how we can pray more, actively participate in the life of our parish family and the universal Church and give sacrificially of our first fruits. We invite all parishioners to participate in this spiritual process, the goal of which is to strengthen the ministry of our parish by calling everyone into a deeper level of discipleship and relationship with the Lord Jesus.
