AMENDMENT 3 EDUCATION

What would Amendment 3 actually do?

Permit abortion even when the preborn child can feel pain

It would allow abortion for any reason before “viability,” defined in the Amendment as a fetus being able to sustain life outside the womb without extraordinary medical measures. A preborn child can survive outside the womb at 22-24 weeks of pregnancy (approximately 6 months). Science has shown that a preborn child can feel pain as early as 12 weeks.
